

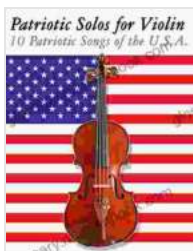

This now-familiar patriotic song was written by a Baptist minister and received its first public performance at an Independence Day celebration by the Boston Sabbath School Union in 1831. It was written to replace a German patriotic text sung to the same tune.

## 5. The Battle Hymn of the Republic

Julia Ward Howe's powerful anthem, originally written as a poem in 1861, became a rallying cry for both the Union and Confederate armies during the American Civil War. Its stirring lyrics and invigorating melody capture the determination and unwavering belief in the cause of freedom.

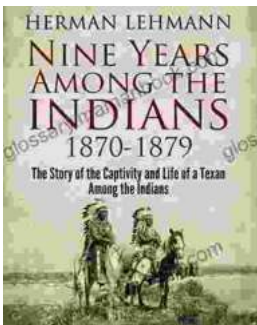
