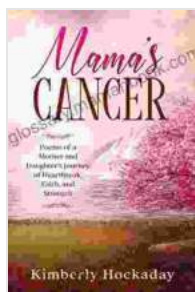

Follow your dreams, and never give up.

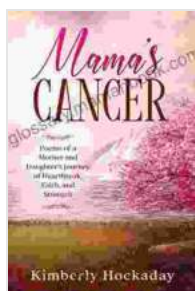

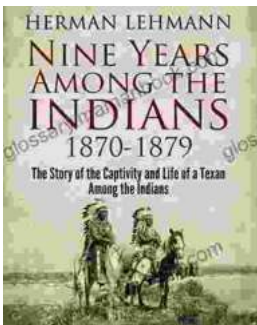
